

Situation	What to do...
<b>Student feels sick / shows symptoms</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If symptoms come up at school, parents will be called, and student and siblings will be sent home immediately.</li> <li>• All students in the home may return to school if the symptoms disappear within 24 hours and they have not been exposed to any individual infected with COVID-19</li> <li>• If symptoms <u>do not</u> disappear within 24 hours, the individual should visit their healthcare provider for COVID-19 testing (it is important to note the type of test administered) and quarantine with the entire family while awaiting the test result. In this case, documentation of a negative test for COVID-19 and 24-hours with no fever (without fever-reducing medication) is required.</li> <li>• Virtual learning goes into effect while at home</li> </ul>
<b>Student tests <u>positive</u> for COVID-19</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Principal will send COVID-19 Exposure and Cohort Quarantine letter to community and cohort.</li> <li>• Cohort quarantines for <u>14 days</u> from last contact.</li> <li>• Virtual learning goes into effect.</li> <li>• Student must complete <u>10 days isolation</u> from date of first symptom and be fever free for 24 hrs. without fever-reducing meds and other symptoms 75% improved.</li> <li>• Dr's note documenting alternative diagnosis or negative COVID-19 test required to return to school.</li> </ul>
<b>Student tests <u>negative</u> for COVID-19</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Student must be fever-free for 24 hrs. with no fever-reducing meds and other symptoms 75% improved.</li> <li>• Follow healthcare provider directions, recommended treatment and <u>return to school guidance</u>.</li> <li>• Dr's note documenting alternative diagnosis or negative COVID-19 test required to return to school</li> </ul>
<b><u>Exposure:</u> Student's household member shows symptoms</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Notify the school immediately</li> <li>• The student remains at home until family member gets tested/results.</li> <li>• Virtual learning goes into effect.</li> <li>• If family member <u>does not test</u>, or <u>tests positive</u>, the student must quarantine for 14 days from the last contact with infected member.</li> <li>• If family member has a <u>negative test result</u>, the student returns to school. Dr's note documenting alternative diagnosis or negative COVID-19 test required to return to school</li> </ul>
<b>Travel to states <u>on/ out</u> Chicago Travel Quarantine List (CTQL)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parent monitors health. If a household member travels within the CTQL, student is permitted to return to school, following that:</li> <li>• The student remains at home until family member gets tested and results are cleared. Virtual learning goes into effect.</li> <li>• If family member <u>does not test</u>, <u>tests positive</u>, or travels to <u>states outside</u> of the CTQL, the student must quarantine for 14 days from the last contact with infected member.</li> <li>• If family member has a <u>negative test result</u>, the student returns to school. Dr's note documenting alternative diagnosis or negative COVID-19 test required to return to school</li> </ul>
<b>Strong recommendations</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Do the right thing. Take every precaution and follow CDC guidelines; wear masks, physically distance, avoid crowds and large gatherings, and wash hands often</li> <li>• More importantly, BE A POSTIVE ROLE MODEL FOR OUR CHILDREN</li> </ul>
